Kath Nelson led the $\vee 5$ round to $\vee$ Q. I led $\uparrow 2$ to $\uparrow J$ which held. I next played $\uparrow Q$ and Jeff discarded $\downarrow$ 2. Kath incorrectly also let this win. I now woke up and ran 10 . When this held I had an easy 9 tricks by knocking out the $\wedge \mathrm{A}$ and picking up the $\stackrel{l}{ }$ later. After the $\vee Q$, I should have led the $\uparrow 10$ and then the $\boldsymbol{\wedge} 2$ to the $\boldsymbol{A}$. When I discover the 5-1 split I can then run the 10. If Kath had won the $\uparrow Q$ and continued $\vee I$ don't have the entries now to make $4 \bullet$ tricks.

Brian Cornelius chose to open $2 \boldsymbol{\circ}$ on the E hand and when Gary Hyett responded $2 v$ launched into RKCB. The $5 *$ response showed $0 / 3$ which is impossible as how can Gary give a $2 v$ positive to $2 \%$ with 0 controls but unfortunately there are not 3 controls missing in the E hand. Brian could only convert to $5 v$ and Gary raised to $6 v$ standard practice when you have 3 controls. Brian passed and missed $7 \vee$ bid by our team mates. We beat them 17-3 just enough to win by 1 V.P.

A lot depends on the choice of opening bid on the $S$ hand and the action taken by E-W. If $S$ opens $1 \vee$ then I think $N$ should sail to 6v especially if $\mathrm{E}-\mathrm{W}$ barrage in $\uparrow$. If S opens 1 NT and W bid 3 (WJO) then it is more difficult.
